

2026 Fellowship Greenville Father / Son Campout - FAQs

How much will this cost?	The cost is \$85 per family (includes father and all sons). Additional adults, like grandfathers, are welcome to attend for an additional \$25 as well.
Who should come?	Grandfathers/Fathers with sons six years old through 18. (For families without a father present, a grandfather can bring his grandsons for the \$85 cost. For families that will be bringing father and son(s), their grandfather can come and participate as “additional adult” mentioned above.)
What are we doing?	This year’s campout will be at Sadlers Creek State Park (the same place as last year). There will be several activities in and around the water. We will be competing as multiple teams. Tentative Itinerary: • Friday night: Orientation, Dinner (on your own), Large Group Campfire, and possibler Nighttime Activity • Saturday Morning: Father/Son Devotional, Morning Activity, Lunch, Free Time, Afternoon Activity, Large Group Dinner & S’mores Bar, Father/Son Blessing Ceremony • Sunday: Father/Son Devotional, Breakfast, Morning Activity, Free Time and Tear Down.
What food is covered?	The cost of the trip will cover all three meals on Saturday and Breakfast on Sunday. Friday dinner is not provided. Consider taking your son out for dinner on the way in or bringing your own food for Friday night.
What clothes should I bring?	Look at the local Anderson, SC forecast to determine your clothing choices. It is suggested that you bring an extra layer/jacket to wear after sunset. Additionally, bring a couple of extra changes of clothes since there is water nearby. There will be lots of red mud by the lake. Bring clothes that you are OK with possibly getting stained.
What camping gear should we bring?	This is a primitive camp set up with limited water and restrooms available. There is a central water faucet and restroom. The restroom near our part of camp does NOT have a shower. You will need to bring at minimum: • Tent • Sleeping Mat & Bag & Pillow • Clothes • Bathing Suit(s) • Towel(s)

	• Life Preservers (if needed) • Toiletries & Medications • Flashlights (w/ extra batteries) Additional items could include: • Tarp & Ropes • Pocketknife • Fire Starters • Personal Snacks • Fishing Gear (Don't forget to purchase a license if needed.) • Water Bottle • Kayak, Paddleboards, Canoes (required to have life preservers.)
When	October 2-4 Plan to arrive between 3:00 and 7:00 pm on Friday, Oct. 2. Checkout is at 12:00 noon on Sunday, Oct. 4th.
Where	Sadlers Creek State Park - 940 Sadlers Creek Rd, Anderson, SC 29626 From Greenville, take I-85 South. Take Exit 14 and turn left onto SC 187. Follow SC 187 for approx. 13 miles. Turn left onto State Road S-4-741 (Sadlers Creek Rd.). Stay straight until the end of the road. We will be camping on the right side at the end of the road.
Other Details	• Safety Rules are as follows: ○ No one-on-one (Adult and youth) that isn't father/son or grandfather/grandson ○ Two-deep adult leadership. Outside of father and son, there should always be at least two adults present around youth. ○ Youth need to stay in buddy groups of at least three people when going out alone. ○ Fathers and Grandfathers are responsible for the safety of their children, especially around the water. ○ Life preservers should be worn in deep water. (water over your head) • No BB guns should be brought in since we are in a public State Park. • All camping areas are primitive, tent-only camping areas. There are NO sites that have electricity or water hookups. • The Saturday evening blessing ceremony is a time where Fathers publicly bless their son(s) in front of the large fellowship of men. In the past some Fathers have used this time to give a special gift to their sons. A gift is not required, but could be a memorable keepsake for your son(s).
